Spring 2016 Course Selection:

□ BIB-101: Tanakh (OT) Survey

This course focuses not just on the Biblical text itself but also on the historical-cultural background and foreground of the Bible, thus it serves not only as an introduction to the Hebrew Bible (OT) but simultaneously as an introduction to the Ancient Near East.

□ BIB-220: Bible Exegesis – Wisdom & Poetry

This 12-week course will cover exegetical analysis of Hebrew Wisdom Literature and poetry. The course will explore both Biblical texts and other significant Jewish literature (Midrashic, Tannaitic, Qumranic, etc.).

☐ HEB-101: Biblical Hebrew I

This 12-week course will cover Biblical Hebrew Grammar. This is the language used for almost all of the Tanakh text (except Daniel 2-7 and small portions of Ezra and Jeremiah). This course will work from the Ashuri block script form of Hebrew, which is also associated with Biblical Aramaic.

☐ HEB-201: Biblical Hebrew II

This 12-week course will complete Ross's coverage of Biblical Hebrew Grammar and introduce Hebrew Exegesis. This is the language used for almost all of the Tanakh text (except Daniel 2-7 and small portions of Ezra and Jeremiah). This course will work from the Ashuri block script form of Hebrew, which is also associated with Biblical Aramaic.

□ ARAM-101: Biblical Aramaic

This 12-week course will cover Biblical (Persian and Babylonian) Aramaic Grammar and Exegesis. This is the language used for Daniel 2-7 and small portions of Ezra and Jeremiah. This course will work from the Ashuri block script form shared with Hebrew.

□ LAN-240: Theological German

Very much theological and religious commentary historically took (and still takes) its form in German. Much of this material has been translated to English, but much has not. Even where it has been translated, we are always better off working from the original language than being beholden to the agenda (conscious or not) of a translator.
